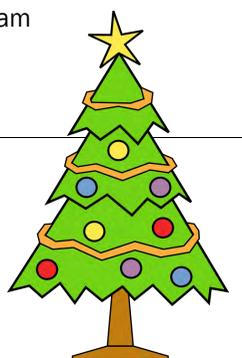

M5 Spice Rub

For Hasselback Potato Recipe on Page 12 - Makes 1 cup

INGREDIENTS

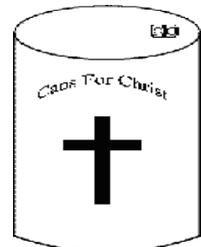
3 tbsp. kosher salt	2 tsp. flaky sea salt (such as Maldon)
2 tbsp. crushed red pepper	1/4 tsp. freshly ground black pepper
1 tbsp. dried rosemary	1/4 tsp. garlic powder
1 tbsp. dried thyme	

DIRECTIONS

Stir together salt, crushed red pepper, dried rosemary, dried thyme, flaky sea salt, freshly ground black pepper, and garlic powder in a bowl. Store in an airtight container up to six months.

Jeffco Action Center – November Mission

Each year The Action Center provides almost 1,400 households with 5,200 individual Thanksgiving meals. This event serves Jefferson County residents and those experiencing homelessness and utilizes over 400 volunteers to make this one-day event happen. This unique distribution allows participants to drive through one of eight lanes and remain warm in their vehicle while volunteers load the meal kits - filled with Thanksgiving fixins' - into the participant's vehicles. This year's distribution will be Saturday November 21, 9 am - 1 pm.



This means we have to be in high gear for our offerings because we have only the 1, 8, and 15 to receive the offering.

My challenge to you is \$1000 for this wonderful cause. Let's provide Thanksgiving Meals for many of our neighbors who are in need. Thank you for your blessings.

A heads up for what is coming next.

Due to the fires in our state we want to reach out to help those who lost property and homes so our mission offering for November 22 through December 27 will go to one of the communities hard hit. Cast-Iron Hasselback Potatoes

INGREDIENTS

5 tbsp. unsalted butter, melted and divided, plus more for pan
6 medium russet or Yukon Gold potatoes (about 2 pounds)
2 tsp. *M5 Spice Rub*, divided (see recipe P. 8)
2 tbsp. chopped fresh flat-leaf parsley
Sour cream, for serving

DIRECTIONS

1. Preheat oven to 425°F. Grease a 12-inch cast-iron pan with butter. Cut each potato crosswise into 1/8-inch-thick slices without cutting all the way through to bottom and leaving about 1/4 inch of potato intact (this will help them hold together). **HINT:** set two chopsticks on either side of the potato to keep the knife from going all the way through while you slice. Arrange potatoes in pan 1 inch apart. Brush with 2 1/2 tablespoons butter. Sprinkle with 1 teaspoon spice rub.
2. Cover pan with aluminum foil and bake 30 minutes. Remove foil and drizzle potatoes (which should have opened up slightly) with remaining 2 1/2 tablespoons butter and 1 teaspoon spice rub. Bake, uncovered, until potatoes are crispy on edges and soft in the middle, 15 to 20 minutes. Garnish with parsley. Serve with sour cream alongside.
