about \$25 to \$30K to have this done: so adding what we need to complete the addition, \$25K, and the \$30K for the parking lot we need about \$55K.

King Sooper funds available so it will make the needed amount less.

With tax time and many refunds already in the mail, this may be a good time for you to give a

little (or a lot) to the church for this special need. We know this is a lot to ask but when it is all finished the church will be in very good shape.

## **Maundy Thursday Service**

April 13 at 6:30pm

Maundy Thursday is the Thursday before Easter, believed to be the day when Jesus celebrated his final Passover with His disciples. Most notably, that Passover meal was when Jesus washed the feet of His disciples in an extraordinary display of humility. He then commanded them to do the same for each other.

Christ's "mandate" is commemorated on Maundy Thursday---"maundy" being a shortened form of "mandatum" (Latin), which means "command." It was on the Thursday of Christ's final week before being crucified and resurrected that He said these words to his disciples: "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another" (John 13:34).

We will sing songs that reflect the Passover, the agony Jesus experienced during His trials and crucifixion and the forgiveness of sin we receive through His shed blood on the cross. The service will conclude with everyone gathering around the table to observe communion.

The Council met on March 8<sup>th</sup> with seven members and 4 guests present. The property and grounds committee reported that they are looking at the lights on the outside of the building and will fix those when weather permits. At this time there is some interference with the lights and the photo sensors on the security system. Kevin is adding the street address to the front sign, as was requested for safety issues. This will help any emergency vehicles to find our church easier if needed.

We did discuss what to do with the organ that belonged to the original St. Paul's. It was decided to take a look at the organ and get a professional opinion about its condition and possibilities. #### CHEESY EASTER BREAKFAST CASSEROLE

"This hearty casserole has bacon, eggs, hash browns, and three different cheeses all baked into a comforting breakfast dish, perfect for feeding a crowd."

1 pound sliced bacon, diced

2 cups shredded Cheddar cheese

1 sweet onion, chopped

1 1/2 cups small curd cottage cheese

9 eggs, lightly beaten

1 1/4 cups shredded Swiss cheese

4 cups frozen shredded hash brown potatoes, thawed

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease a 9x13-inch baking dish.

Heat a large skillet over medium-high heat; cook and stir bacon and onion until bacon is evenly browned, about 10 minutes. Drain. Transfer bacon and onion to a large bowl. Stir in potatoes, eggs, Cheddar cheese, cottage cheese, and Swiss cheese. Pour mixture into prepared baking dish.

Bake in preheated oven until eggs are set and cheese is melted, 45 to 50 minutes.

Let stand 10 minutes before cutting and serving.
