The Good Lord has surely blessed us with much needed water all around our state. It was reported the month of March 2021 was the wettest on record for Colorado. Let's pray the month of April is just like March.

The Council met on March 10th and discussed the following issues:

1. A Best Buy representative will meet with Pastor Kim to discuss the best place to locate a large TV in the Sanctuary.
2. Pastor Kim announced our Easter Service would be outside while maintaining COVID-19 ten-foot separation. We will not have to wear our masks when we are seated but we need to put our masks on to sing, which we can do as loud as we want. HOORAY!!!
3. The Downstairs Garden Level room lights have all been converted to LED and this will save us money on our electric bill.
4. Additional 120-volt receptacles will be added in the Garden Level Hall. This should decrease the necessity for extension cords, which can become tripping hazards.
5. We have accepted the bid from Colorado Pavement Solutions to have the entire West Parking Lot milled by 2 inches and then repaved. Then we will have new stripping done. The milled asphalt will be placed and leveled out on our existing non-paved area.

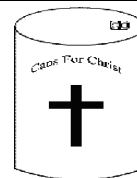
