The Council met on April 10th. Pastor Kim told us about Rex's fall that had happened that day. Clark has volunteered to help Pastor Kim with the mowing this summer but we will need volunteers to help keep the weeds down in the area behind the parking lot and with the new plantings around the church. It is not necessary to sign up just if you have some spare time and want to help just come and do what you can.

We have reserved the large shelter house at Morse Park for the 125th anniversary of the church on September 15, 2019. Further details will follow.

Many activities are planned for this summer-starting with the Mother's Day luncheon on May 12th. The Pancake breakfast in the parking lot on June 8th. July 14th will be the Birthday bash after fellowship. This will be for all the congregation. It will be a potluck and each month will have their own table and hopefully will bring in and decorate their table accordingly. Example February may do Valentines theme and December may do Christmas. It will take some planning but should be a fun day.

July 28th will be the Cook-out and Auction. This will be one of 2 Building Fund raisers planned for this year. More information to follow. Clark has volunteered to do an analysis of the church's electrical system. He will bring his recommendations to the board.
