


A safety note: Be mindful of your car doors and how the wind can whip them closed on us.

Kelly's Breakfast Egg Dish

Made by Patti for May 26, 2024 Fellowship Serves 12

Ingredients

12 eggs

3 c. milk

3 Tbsp. Hatch's mild green chilis (entire little diced can)

2 Tbsp. dry ranch dressing powder (entire pouch)

4 c. grated cheddar cheese

tater tots

bacon crumbles

Directions

Mix first 5 ingredients.

Lightly grease 10x15 pan (Note: this is larger than the typical 9x13 pan)

Put frozen tater tots in a tight, single layer on the bottom.

Dump egg mixture on top.

Sprinkle cooked bacon crumbles on top (can put bacon on after cooked, or just before serving)

Bake 350° for one hour. Let stand for 10 minutes before cutting to serve.

Chicken Casserole

Made by Dorothy for May 19, 2024 Fellowship

Ingredients

2 c. chicken, cooked	1 c. chicken broth
1 (8-oz) pkg. Noodles	2 c. cheddar cheese, shredded
1 can cream of mushroom soup	1 stick butter
1 can cream of celery soup	1 sleeve Ritz crackers, crushed

Directions

Cook noodles according to package directions.

Mix first 5 ingredients together and place in a greased 9×13 inch baking dish. Sprinkle mixture with cheddar cheese.

Melt butter and mix with crushed crackers. Sprinkle cracker mixture over cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes.

(You may also mix ahead, refrigerate, and bake for 40-50 minutes or until bubbly.)



Pineapple Dump Cake

Made by Bette for May 19, 2024 Fellowship

Ingredients

- 20 oz.can crushed pineapple
- 20 oz. can pineapple chunks or tidbits
- $\frac{1}{2}$ c. light brown sugar
- 1 box white or yellow cake mix
- 1 c. butter, melted

Directions

Preheat oven to 350° and prepare a 9x13 pan with a light coat of cooking spray.

Spread both cans of pineapple evenly on the bottom of the pan (juice included).

Sprinkle brown sugar evenly over the pineapple.

Distribute cake mix over the pineapple in an even layer.

Pour the melted butter over the cake mix.

Bake for 50 to 55 minutes.

Allow to cool 10 minutes before serving.

Note: Make sure you spray corners very well. Make sure the pineapple is evenly spread across the bottom of the pan. Shake dish once so the cake mix falls into open spaces.
