NOTE: Everyone in the church is invited to this annual event!

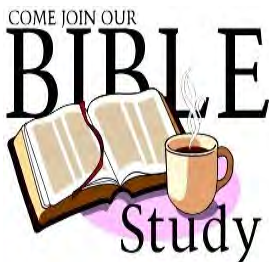
Lap Quilters:

HASH BROWN POTATO QUICHE (HELEN E)

3 cups frozen hash brown potatoes, thawed	1 jalapeno chili, finely chopped
1/3 cup butter, melted	(optional)
1 cup cooked ham, chopped	2 eggs
1 cup (4 oz.) Cheddar cheese, shredded	1/2 cup milk
1/4 cup green, yellow, or red bell pepper, chopped	1/2 tsp. salt
1/4 cup onion, finely chopped (optional)	1/4 tsp. pepper

Spread the potatoes on paper towels and press out any remaining moisture. Pat the potatoes over the bottom and up the side of an ungreased 9" pie plate. Drizzle the butter over the potatoes, making sure the edge is totally covered. Bake at 425 degrees for 25 minutes. Reduce the oven temperature to 350 degrees.

Layer the ham, cheese, pepper, onion and jalapeno over the baked crust. Whisk the eggs, milk, salt and pepper in a bowl until blended and pour over the prepared layers. Bake for 25 minutes, or until a knife inserted in the center comes out clean. Refrigerate any leftovers. Serves 8

I doubled the recipe and put in a 9 x 13" cake pan.
