Pumpkin Cranberry Bread

As served by Marge W for Fellowship September 21

Ingredients

- 3 cups flour
- 1 Tbsp. plus 2 tsp. pumpkin pie spice
- 2 tsp. baking soda
- 1 1/2 tsp. salt
- 3 cups sugar
- 1 can (15 oz.) 100% pure pumpkin
- 4 large eggs
- 1 cup vegetable oil
- 1/2 cup orange juice or water
- 1 cup sweetened dried, fresh or frozen cranberries



Instructions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease and flour 2 9x5 loaf pans.

Combine dry ingredients in a large bowl.

Combine sugar, pumpkin, eggs, oil, and juice in large mixer bowl.

Beat until just blended.

Add to flour mixture - stir until moistened.


Fold in cranberries.

Put in pans.

Bake 60 - 65 minutes or until wooden pick inserted into center come out clean.

Cool for 10 minutes and remove from pans to cool completely.
