"Souper Bowl for Action Center"

For many years St. Paul's has joined hundreds of churches around the country to restock the many depleted food banks. From Thanksgiving to Christmas our food banks have been strained trying to meet the needs in our communities. Since its humble beginnings in 1990, the organization has raised over \$198 million in food and funds, directly benefiting local hunger-relief charities. The Action Center benefits from St. Paul's at least three times a year - Souper Bowl in January, School Supplies in July, and Thanksgiving Turkeys in November.
